Why enroll with a Health Home?

The Health Home partners with hospitals, physicians, local agencies and community providers to improve the health of the community and the care available individuals. Health Home Care Managers are caring professionals who talk with you about your needs and goals and help you to achieve your goals. They also know where to go and who to talk with, in order to make sure your needs are met as quickly as possible and that you have to supports needed for recovery.

All of the professionals involved in your care work together in order to provide the services you need to make your life meaningful.

A dedicated Care Manager is assigned to you and is responsible for coordinating your health services. The Care Manager also provides education and information to you so that you can make informed decisions about your own care.

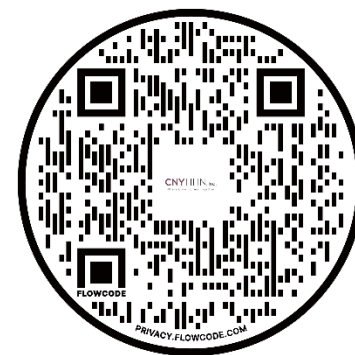
The Health Home can guide and assist you when you have questions or need access to services.

Who pays for Health Home services?

Medicaid and Medicaid Managed Care pays for Care Management services for those who are eligible. It does not cost you anything to enroll.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is a Health Home?

A “Health Home” is not a place; it is a group of health care and service providers working together to make sure you get the care and services you need to stay healthy. Once you are enrolled in a Health Home, you will have your own Care Manager. The Care Manager will work with you to set up a Care Plan and appointments and get the services you need to put you on the road to better health. This is Health Home Care Management.

How is it different from other Care Management?

Health Home Care Managers are trained to consider all of your needs. Therefore, you receive support in areas you may not have had assistance with before, including housing, legal assistance and becoming involved in social or community activities. The help you receive is driven by your goals and the needs you identify. Care Managers also help when you are in the hospital to make sure your needs at the time of discharge are met.

Who pays for Health Home services?

Medicaid and Medicaid Managed Care pays for Care Management services for those who are eligible. It does not cost you anything to enroll.

How do I know if I qualify for Health Home services?

If you are an adult and are eligible or have Medicaid or Medicaid Managed Care you may qualify for services if:

- You have 2 or more chronic medical or mental health conditions or
- 1 of the singly qualifying conditions

If you have a child 21 years old or younger that is eligible for or has Medicaid or Medicaid Managed Care, you may qualify for services if:

- You have 2 or more chronic medical or mental health conditions or
- 1 of the singly qualifying conditions
- To find out if your child qualifies, call the Health Home at: 1-855-784-1262

What are the advantages of being in a Health Home?

- You have one care manager who is coordinating your care and services.
- Your care manager can help you understand how to manage your health care and social needs
- You have a team of providers available to you for questions you may have
- Your care manager will make sure that your providers are talking to each other to help you stay healthy.
